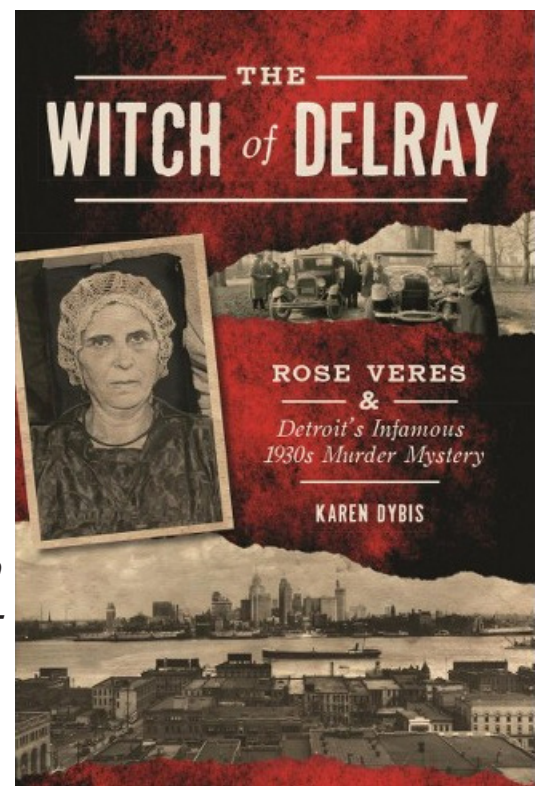


The Witch of Delray

At the Detroit boardinghouse of Hungarian immigrant Rose Veres, there was a mysterious murder in 1931. Amid accusations of witchcraft, Rose and her son Bill were convicted of the brutal killing and were suspected of a dozen more. Their cries of innocence went unheeded—until one lawyer, determined to seek justice, took on the case.
