On August 3, 1982, the Friends of St. Clair Shores Historical Commission was formed. Ten years later the name was changed to the Historical Society of St. Clair Shores. The Historical Society is comprised of dedicated members of the community who are interested in collecting and preserving the history of the city for future generations to enjoy.

The Society's Responsibilities are:

- To support the mission of the Selinsky-Green Farmhouse Museum to act as a representation of rural life in the late 19th and early 20th centuries.
- To maintain an association with persons in the mission of collecting, preserving and recording the history of St. Clair Shores.
- To support and cooperate with the St. Clair Shores Historical Commission in developing programs to further the mission.
- To stimulate donation of historical artifacts, photographs, desirable collections and bequests.
- To support the publication of Muskrat Tales.
- To encourage and enhance local history-related events, such as the genealogical pursuits, oral histories and programs.
- To provide a channel for individuals and organizations to express ideas and make suggestions to the Historical Commission for appropriate programs and projects.
- To aid in fundraising to meet the special Historical Commission needs when requested.
