ALBERT KAHN: INNOVATION AND INFLUENCE ON 20TH CENTURY ARCHITECTURE

Perhaps Detroit's best-known architect, Albert Kahn was a German-born Jewish immigrant who came to Detroit with his family as a youth and went on to become the world's leading industrial designer and creator of some of the city's most iconic buildings. The Fisher Building, the Conservatory and Aquarium on Belle Isle and multiple structures on the University of Michigan campus were all designed by Kahn. His streamlined, light-filled factories for Henry Ford and other manufacturers became a seminal influence on European modernists who developed the principles of modern architecture. This new exhibition tells Kahn's story through photos, video clips, maps and text panels, as well as both wood and Lego architectural models. Visitors will see Kahn's hand-drawn architectural sketches, artifacts from Kahn's office, and more. Albert Kahn Legacy Foundation ambassador/docents will be in the exhibit at 1pm.

Tickets are \$15 per person and includes bus transportation from the SCS library to the Museum and back. The bus will leave the SCS Library at 12 noon. For the return trip, please be on the bus before it departs the Detroit Historical Museum at 2:30 pm.
